Hello Westview Families,

Our staff is ready to welcome you all to the new school year. The classrooms are set up to create a community of learners, the lunchroom is ready for our meals and lockers and desks labeled for your child. We appreciate that most of you were able to facilitate the 1:1 meeting between your child and the teacher and help us get paperwork completed. We will assure all students are assessed and paperwork will be sent home if you weren't able to make it.

We will continue to have safe, healthy practices for our school community by all wearing masks while indoors, washing hands, sanitizing each evening and a Hepa filter in each room. Students will also need to wear a mask on the bus. At this time, we are also limiting visitors into the building so you will not be able to walk your child to their rooms or join us for lunch. There will be some situations where volunteers can support teachers for a limited time. We appreciate your support in all these efforts.

We will be using a pick-up process at the end of the day for families who drive their children to school. Staff will use your household number you received with your child's paperwork during assessments or that will be brought home on the first day of school to dismiss your child from class as you arrive into the parking lot. You can put the paper in the right hand side dashboard space for us to easily see. Don't worry if you don't have it on the first day,

Masks Required on Buses & Inside Schools

State officials have given school districts the responsibility to determine COVID-19 mitigation strategies at the local level this school year. The 2021-22 COVID-19 Operational Plan that was unanimously approved by our School Board on August 26 requires all students, staff and visitors in all District 196 buildings to wear a face mask indoors when the local transmission level is "substantial" or "high" as measured by the CDC transmission matrix. Currently, the transmission level in Dakota County is high, meaning face masks will be required in our schools to start the year, just as they are required to enter a growing number of businesses, government buildings and on all public transportation and airline flights.

Your partnership is critical to the success of our students. We expect students, staff and visitors to comply with the mask requirement until the COVID-19 spread in Dakota County drops to the "moderate" level of transmission. Masks help reduce spread and give us the best opportunity to provide in-person education all year. Just like last year, students will have opportunities for mask breaks during the day, such as at lunch or while outside. Medical exemptions will be allowed with confirmation from a health professional. If parents and guardians are concerned about their child's ability to safely wear a mask, school staff will partner with families to determine alternative options, build skills and layer mitigation strategies to protect the learning community.

Our district is committed to doing all we can to ensure students can continue learning in person this school year. This includes HEPA filters in all learning spaces, social distancing, recommending COVID-19 vaccinations for those who are eligible to receive them, and requiring masks when the local transmission level is substantial or high.





Here Comes the Bus

At the beginning of the 2019-20 school year, District 196 parents whose children ride the bus to and from school each day will be able to track the location of their child's bus using the smartphone application "Here Comes the Bus."

With Here Comes The Bus, parents are able to set up a perimeter around their child's bus stop. When their child's bus enters that perimeter, the app sends an alert. Here Comes The Bus also sends notification messages if a bus is running late or if a different bus has been substituted for a child's usual bus. The app uses HTTPS, or Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure, which encrypts all communication between the web browser and the app for security. The app tracks district buses using GPS; it does not track students.

Setting up the app

The Here Comes The Bus app is available to download free on the **Google Play Store** for Android and **App Store** for iPhone.

To set up an account, parents will need a school identification number and their child's lunch account number. Parents will be able to monitor buses for multiple children from a single account. Schools will share setup instructions and school identification numbers with parents. If you did not receive it, ask your child's school.

- Log into the app with your email address and use the District 196 ID: 73500
- Add your student's name and student lunch account number, which can be found in their Infinite Campus profile. (If your child is in Early Childhood Education, contact the Transportation to get a temporary lunch account number. Email **Transportation@district196.org**.)
- Once login is complete, set up a virtual radius that will alert when the bus is in the area.



Student Drop-Off/Pickup Information

Students who get dropped off or picked up from school, will use the front parking lot perimeter only. It is not safe to drop your child off in the parked car areas. Vehicles can load/unload anywhere along the yellow curb. All families will receive a paper indicating a household number during the summer assessment days. For after school pick up, please display this number on the right hand side of your dashboard / windshield. This will allow us to enter the numbers into an app which will guickly notify the classroom teacher to release your child (ren) from class. Always pull up as far as you can along the yellow curb. Please be patient during these times since we have many students who still need assistance getting in and out of a car seat or require hand-to-hand adult support. Big buses will load and unload along Garden View Drive. Small buses will use the north drop off area.
