School Supply Kit Update

This year, PTO offered a new option for purchasing school supplies through the company 1st Day School **Supplies**. When we committed to them, no one knew that this pandemic would be coming, that kids would be returning late, that assessments would look so different, and that needs in our classrooms and at home might change. Despite all this, 1st Day School **Supplies** met and exceeded our expectations. Supplies were delivered at assessments as promised, and even with changing lines of delivery and availability for some of the items (like disinfecting wipes and facial tissue) the needs were met. Certainly many parents who didn't use 1st Day School Supplies may have had a harder time finding wipes, for example. For parents who opted in to this program, it meant that you didn't have to worry about sourcing these supplies while doing everything else that is necessary to get ready to go back to school – either hybrid or distance learning. You could count on the specific things requested by the teachers being delivered and ready to use! The average cost for a box of supplies was approximately \$45, although obviously varied by grade. Ordering was online and easy – no searching for the school lists, no shipping costs, no driving all over to multiple stores. The time and energy saved for parents was great, and the cost was still very reasonable. There was even an option to order additional items, like t-shirts or backpacks, to even further streamline the process. We had almost 100 kids from our population of approximately 400 use the service. Next year, we hope to be back to a more "normal" school year and with that, we hope to see use of this program grow!

NEW Student Drop-Off & Pick-Up Area

NEW Student drop off and pick up information for parents and busses this year!

For safety and social distancing purposes, we are implementing a new drop off and pick up system for students who ride district school busses, daycare vans or arrive in a vehicle.

- **⇒** Parent pick up and drop off will be IN FRONT of the school (formerly bus area). Parents need to be parked along the yellow curb to load or unload children. Students will enter the main front doors, #1. If students arrive before 9:10, they will stand on the sidewalk using 6 ft safe spacing. After school, students will stand in family groups. Please do not pull ahead to cut into the line. Be patient and pull forward as the line moves. As you exit the parking lot, there will be a designated right turn lane and a straight/left turn lane. These will be painted onto the blacktop.
- **■** BIG busses will park and load and unload in the parking lane on Garden View. Continued in next column...

Students will enter/exit door #3 (music/gym hallway doors).

 □ LITTLE busses and daycare vans will drop off and pick up in the BACK area (formerly parent drop off/pick up area) and enter/exit through the cafeteria door, #7.

SACC drop off and pick up will continue to be at the back area and enter through the cafeteria door.
